
### **HANDSTANDS**



#### Introduction:

This article presents a word game called *Handstands*.



Failed Attempts: A, G, V, T, N



The gameplay is very similar to *Hangman*. There are two players. One selects a set of words in advance and draws blanks for their letters, <u>marking the locations of repeated letters</u>. A second player will guess one letter at a time, until either all words are completed, or they reach 6 failed guesses, at which point a person performing a handstand is drawn to signify the failure.

Unlike hangman, which prioritizes short phrases or longer words containing many distinct letters, handstands prioritize choosing many semantically unrelated words that together use as few letters as possible.


The remainer of this article is game set, and I've provided the solutions in such a way that you can play by yourself or with a partner.
